




Principal's Message










School Hours / Attendance - Our school hours are 8:30 - 3:20 for kindergarten to grade 6 students, Monday to Friday. Our Headstart hours are Tuesday - Friday from 9:00 - 12:00. Our Headstart students are now located right next to the school in their newly renovated classroom. We ask that students be on time for school and attend school each day if they are feeling well. Each morning, we have our 100 minutes of uninterrupted literacy for all students. At this time, students are learning essential literacy concepts to read and write at grade level. If a student is consistently late for school or has poor attendance, they are at risk of falling behind.

Student Safety - Our number one priority as a school is the safety and well-being of each and every one of our awasisak. Therefore, we conduct four fire drills throughout the year as well as three lockdown drills. Parents will receive a letter informing you when we practice our fire drills and lockdown drills. Our first fire drill will be on September 16. This is always a fun day for students because the fire department brings out the fire truck, and students get to learn about the fire truck and the equipment they use. The highlight of the day is when students get to take turns using the fire hose.



Student Wellness - Alongside student safety is student wellness. One of the advantages of being in a small school and community is that every staff member develops close relationships with all of our awasisak. We want our students to feel safe, loved and excited to come to school. Our staff is traumainformed and we ensure every interaction is from a trauma-informed lens. We also have a full-time counsellor on staff for group work and individual 1 on 1 counselling.

Inside Shoes / Warm Clothing - If possible we ask that each student has a pair of inside shoes at school for activities inside the school, gym class and any emergency drills that take place throughout the year. Warm clothing and proper footwear are also essential for when the season starts to turn to winter. Students have 3 recess breaks each day as well as weekly land-based learning activities.




Cree Language / Land-Based Learning - All of our kindergarten to grade 6 students receive Cree language classes daily from our Cree instructor Bill Lightning. Our staff try to speak as much Cree as we can throughout the school day. We continue to learn daily from Bill Lightning and our fluent Cree speakers on staff.

School Lunch / Breakfast - All students who attend MESC schools receive a breakfast, hot lunch and snacks each day at school. A monthly menu will be included in each newsletter. 



















Grade 3 and 4 Class-Ms. Parmar


Cree and Culture - Mr. Lightning



















Admin. Assistant - Roxanne Baptiste




E.A and Speech - Chantelle Redman
